

Friendship Color Mixing

Materials

- Primary paints (red, blue, and yellow)
- Large paper
- 3 Paper Plates

Create a classroom community through art! ☺

Red, yellow, and blue are great alone, but when you mix them you create something beautiful. This is how lasting friendships are formed. Two individuals coming together to create something beautiful - FRIENDSHIP.

Begin by pouring paints onto 3 separate plates. (Red, blue, and yellow).



Have the children pair up and provide each pair with a large sheet of paper.

Allow each child to choose a color and have them place their hand in the paint.

Once each child has chosen a color, have them put their hands together.



Ask the children:

- "What does the paint feel like on your hands?"
- "What do you think will happen if you hold hands and mix your colors?"
- "Can you create that color again?"
- "How many different colors can you make?"
- How can you make that color brighter?"

As a class, you can have each child add their hand prints a large sheet of paper and create a friendship mural. ☺
