

My Portrait: This activity is a great way to build up social development & fine motor skill for your preschooler.

Materials Needed: Pre-cut people shapes (like paper dolls) on heavy tag board or cardboard; mirrors: markers; crayons, variety of yarn (for hair); scissors; glue

**Direction:** This activity is best done by first having circle/group time so that you have time to talk with the group about their eye color, hair color, etc. (You can have the children pass the mirror around so they can see themselves)

Put the butcher paper down and have the children lay down which at that time you will trace their body, Have the children cut them out and decorate them. Have the children be creative and let them figure where they are going to put their name (On the shirt / Shoes, necklace or bracelet.) Have Fun <sup>(3)</sup>

## Supplies:

- Paint stir stick
- <u>Alphabet stickers</u>
- <u>Clothespins</u>
- <u>Paint</u>
- Picture of your little munchkin

Have the children choose its favorite color and let them paint their stick. Once the paint is dry, Place the alphabet stickers down the bottom and glued a closely cropped picture of his head at the top. To make the clothespins first put the stickers on cardstock and then glued them on the pin (backing them with cardstock first makes them sturdier). Opening and closing the clothespins was a great fine motor task! Have the children match the letters to the exact place on the paint stick. Have Fun! ©
