INSTRUCTION

- 1. Take your piece of paper and cut it into a perfect square.
- An easy way to do this is fold the paper into a triangle, taking one corner and lining it up to the other side. This will leave excess on one side that, once cut, gives you a square! Simple origami windmill. Decorate both sides of the paper with whatever design you wish.

Once all 4 corners are in the middle push the push pin through them all as well as the straw or eraser. Be careful not to hurt yourself with the pin! This is how to make a windmill project for
