This is a great way for your preschoolers to express who they are by creative an Art Collage piece that's based on who they are and what they like though writing and pictures.


Material: White Art Paper / Different color paint / Paint brush / Markers / Duct – Tape / Pictures of their favorite places / Favorite Food
