Letter Collages Activity For Preschoolers



I love letter collages! They are a great way for kids to practice and learn the letters of the alphabet. It helps them connect an object with a letter, which also helps build beginning sound skills!

Directions: Make a bubble letter d on a piece of white cardstock paper with a marker. Have the children trace the letter with a color Marker of their choice. Have your little one start scrunching up pieces of green tissue paper! Put glue ALL over the letter d. They will be filling up the entire letter with scrunched tissue paper. Start placing the scrunched-up tissue paper balls onto the letter. Create spikes out of orange cardstock paper and glue them on the curve of the d. Lastly, make a head shape using green cardstock paper and add a googly eye to finish your letter craft. Have Fun! ©
