PRESCHOOL DIAPERING & TOILET LEARNING

Learning to use the toilet is an important developmental milestone for children. We understand the age of toilet readiness varies per child. Parents and our staff will work together as partners to support children with toilet learning.

Some children may require diapering and additional accommodations and support from staff. Staff will work with parents/guardians to teach children's self-help and toileting skills.

Parent/Guardian:

- Provide multiple changes of clean clothing, particularly underwear, pants & socks to be left at the center or adequate amounts of diapers/pull-ups and wipes to be left at the center.
- Ensure any soiled clothing are taken home each day.
- Dress your child in clothing that can easily be handled or removed by your child such as elastic waist clothing.
- Ensure children are able to clean themselves after toileting.
- Children wearing pull ups/diapers will be checked and/or changed at least every 2 hours and changes will be logged daily.
- Staff may need to call the parent/guardian to return to the program for children needing extensive cleaning (ie: bathing; showering) after a bowel movement.
- Child not fully toilet trained and/or children with consistent toilet accidents will develop a toilet learning plan with center staff.
- Bathrooms with doors will remain open in order for staff to visually supervise your child.
- Children and staff will wash hands after using the toilet or helping your child use a toilet.
- Diapering procedures available upon request.
- Proper cleaning, sanitizing and disinfecting procedures occur.
